





THE INDIVIDUAL

We like big numbers. “The bigger the better,” we think. We like big crowds, big contributions, and big results. We often speak of the corporate group. While I would not always argue against this propensity, I would warn against letting it dim our eyes to the importance of the individual.

Christ often focused on individuals. This is especially seen in the gospel of John. There was Nicodemus in John 3, the woman at the well and the nobleman in John 4, the crippled man in John 5, the woman taken in adultery in John 8, and the blind man in John 9. He spoke to crowds, but He did not ignore the individual. Every single person was important to Him and merited His time and attention.

In fact, though Christ died for the sins of the whole world, He died for me individually and for my personal sins. As someone has expressed it, “Had I been the only sinner in the world, Jesus would still have died, or I would have been eternally lost.”

Christianity is the religion of the individual. We become Christians as individuals (Acts 2:38). We worship God as individuals, though we may do it with a large group of people (cf. 1 Cor. 16:1-2). We have a responsibility to find our place in the body and serve individually (Eph. 4:16). We will face God in judgment as individuals (2 Cor. 5:10). In the preceding passages, phrases such as “every one of you,” “every joint . . . every part” or “each one” leap out at us..

The ramifications of focusing on the individual are far-reaching. We will seek to keep members from getting lost in the crowd or falling through the cracks. We will value every individual. We will not cater to one and neglect another. As teachers, we will teach people and not simply race through a lesson. We will rejoice whenever any sinner repents. We will not automatically think that bigger is better. We will realize our own value as individuals and do what we can do for the cause of Christ.

May God help us to develop the individual-mindedness of Jesus!
