This basic principle is applicable to us all and can be found in Scripture. In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus said, **“Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about its own things. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble”** (Matthew 6:34).

Our Lord knew that each day had enough problems of its own not to borrow from tomorrow. We are not equipped to live more than one day at a time. Bridges should be crossed only when we come to them.
