SUPER SUNDAY

Since Super Bowl XLVIII (the National Football Championship between the Denver Broncos and the Seattle Seahawks) will be played later today, this particular Sunday is often referred to as “Super Sunday.” Come to think of it, every Sunday should be a super day for Christians.

The New Testament has much to say about Sunday, also known as first day of the week, or the Lord’s Day.

- It was early on the first day of the week that Jesus arose from the dead (Matthew 28:1ff).
- It was on two successive Sundays that Jesus appeared to His disciples following His resurrection (Acts 20:19-29).
- It was on the first day of the week (since Pentecost is always on Sunday) that the church was established (Acts 2:1ff).
- It was on the first day of the week that the disciples came together to observe the Lord’s Supper in Troas (Acts 20:7).
- It was on the first day of the week that Paul commanded the Corinthians to make a contribution to the work of the Lord, because he knew they would be together on that day (1 Corinthians 16:1-2).
- It was on the Lord’s Day that John said he was “in the Spirit” (Revelation 1:10).

These citations should impress us with the fact that Sunday is important. It is His day! Let’s make sure we use it to worship and glorify Him.
