WHAT IS THAT STUFF?

A few years ago, a little four-year-old girl named Amanda was sitting with Sierra and me in church. She attended occasionally with her mother and brother but was largely unchurched and did not understand all that was being done. When it came time for the Lord's Supper to be served, she was sitting on Sierra's lap. As the fruit of the vine came by, I held it out so Sierra could take it. Amanda looked at it carefully and said—not exactly in a whisper—“What is that stuff?”

I smiled and handed the tray back to the usher. But, how do you answer that question for a child? Would a child understand that on one hand it is simply Welch's grape juice but on the other hand it represents the blood of Jesus that was shed at Calvary?

I'm fairly certain that a child would not understand, and I can't help but wonder if most of us who are adults think about it all that much ourselves. Do we think what the emblems mean each Sunday, or is our mind a million miles away?

1 Corinthians 11:27 does say that if we partake of the emblems in an unworthy manner we are “guilty of the body and blood of the Lord.”

So today, look carefully at the emblems as they are passed. See more than just a little bit of unleavened bread and a little container of grape juice. See what these simple items represent. See the body and blood of Jesus and realize that Calvary was necessary, because of our sins.
