AMAZING GRACE

Perhaps you have heard the story of the great hymn, *Amazing Grace*, but maybe not.

The words were written by John Newton in 1779. As a young man, he was captain of a slave ship and lived an evil life. In fact, it is reported that due to his way of life, his crew regarded him as little more than an animal.

On one occasion, after being at sea for some time, Newton's ship ran into a violent storm. Much of the cargo was lost, and the crew tied themselves to the ship to keep from being swept overboard. For four weeks, the sailors despaired of life, because of the damage done to the ship. Rations were so low that they feared starvation. Finally they reached a port in Ireland.

Newton credited this event for his "spiritual awakening." Later in life, he became an Anglican priest and a prolific hymn writer. Near the end of his life, he said to a friend, "*My memory is nearly gone, but I remember two things: That I am a great sinner, and that Christ is a great Savior.*"

God's grace is truly amazing; isn't it? Without it, we all would be hopelessly lost. We cannot earn or merit our salvation, but we can be saved "by grace through faith" (Eph. 2:8-9).

As important as this subject is, it seems that everyone would understand, appreciate, and take advantage of God's grace. Such is not the case, however.

This is why our meeting with **Sam Bartrug** and his lessons on "**God's Amazing Grace**" are so important. Please plan to attend yourself and bring others with you.
