30 DAYS OF THANKSGIVING

You've heard the following rhyme, I am sure.

*Thirty days hath September,
April, June, and November.
All the rest have thirty-one,
Excepting February alone,
And that has twenty-eight days clear,
And twenty-nine in each leap year.*

Thanksgiving is my favorite holiday. It is more in keeping with Scripture than any other. My fear, however, is that we may relegate being thankful to one special day a year.

I'm asking us to devote the entire month of November to being especially thankful for all the blessings we have received and continue to receive daily. This does not mean that we should not be thankful during other months of the year, but that we will make a special effort to be thankful during the 30 days of November.

As a part of this, each Sunday morning sermon during the month will focus on some aspect of being thankful. In addition, some specific blessing will be noted for each day of the month, and you will be encouraged to join me in specifically thanking God for that blessing on that day.

As an example, here's the list for the first three days of November:

November 1—Thank God for the gift of His Son.

November 2—Thank God for the church in Seymour.
