

THANK YOU, GOD

According to an old story, a very elderly woman made an appointment to see President Abraham Lincoln one afternoon. As she entered his office, Lincoln arose, seated her, and asked, “How may I be of service to you, Madame?”

The little lady said, “Mr. President, I know you are a busy man. I have not come to ask you for anything. I simply came to bring you this box of cookies, for I heard that you enjoy them so much.”

The President sat silent for a moment, and then he said, “Madame, I thank you for your thoughtful gift. I am greatly moved by it. Since I have been the President of this country, thousands of people have come into this office asking for favors and demanding things from me. You are the first person who has entered these premises asking no favor, and indeed, to bring a gift to me. I thank you from the bottom of my heart.”

I wonder if God ever feels that way? I expect He does. We often stand before Him, with our hands out, saying, “Gimme, Gimme, Gimme.” Don’t misunderstand. I am thankful that He is ever willing and able to answer the prayers of His children, and He doesn’t mind our prayerful requests (Matt. 7:7-11; I Pet. 3:12).

Paul, however, links “thanksgiving” with “prayers and supplications.” ***“Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God”*** (Phil. 4:6).

Don’t you think God would be pleased if we would come before Him occasionally just to thank Him? And, when we think of it, we at Seymour have so much for which to be thankful; don’t we?
