

ONE VOTE

Andrew Johnson was an uncompromising idealist who believed in a strict interpretation of the U.S. Constitution. In one speech, he said of the Constitution, "It is the last hope of human freedom." He served as both U.S. Representative and Senator, before becoming Lincoln's Vice President. Upon Lincoln's assassination on April 15, 1865, Johnson became President.

As President, Johnson had a running battle with a number of the members of Congress over the course of Reconstruction. He wanted to readmit the southern states to the union much as they were before the war, only minus slavery. When Secretary of War Edwin M. Stanton opposed his policies, Johnson removed him from office even though the Tenure of Office Act required Senate approval before the President could remove an appointee.

In 1868, the House voted to impeach the President. The trial was held in the Senate from March to May that year. The outcome was close. In fact, Johnson was acquitted by one single vote, cast by Edmund Ross of Kansas. During the rest of his term, he continued a rocky relationship with those who opposed his policies, but his presidency was saved by that one vote.
