EVANGELISM AND METHODS

The primary mission of the church is the same as Christ's was while He was on earth—"to seek and save that which was lost" (Luke 19:10).

This mission is accomplished through preaching, teaching, and practicing the gospel of Christ. Paul wrote: **"For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes, for the Jew first and also for the Greek"** (Rom. 1:16). That was true then and is still true today.

Methods of evangelism vary from place to place and from time to time. What will work, or be most effective, at one place and time may not work, or be very effective, at another place and time. I have lived long enough to see a number of methods come and go.

We tend to have our favorite method, but God forbid that our methods (programs, techniques, etc.) ever become more important to us than our goal of evangelism. The Lord told us what to do, but He left the how to do it up to us.

Hear His words again: ***"Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you. . ."*** (Matt. 28:19-20a).

Let us prayerfully consider the best methods to use at a given place and time to spread the message of salvation, and then let us dedicate ourselves to that task.
