

PURPOSE OF HEART

The Old Testament book of Daniel opens with Nebuchadnezzar, King of Babylon, laying siege to Jerusalem, taking it captive, and transporting some of the people back to Babylon. He commanded Asphenaz, master of the eunuchs, to bring some of the brightest and fairest of the young men to live in the palace. They were to learn the language and literature of the Babylonians, and they were to eat at the king's table.

This would have been a great privilege and position, but Daniel refused to eat the king's food and drink his wine. Daniel 1:8 says, **“But Daniel purposed in his heart that he would not defile himself with the portion of the king's delicacies, nor with the wine which he drank . . .”**

Most of the food served would probably have been sacrificed to idols, and the food and wine would have violated the dietary laws of the Hebrews. Daniel was a man of character, and he made a resolution not to eat at the king's table. He respectfully requested a more modest diet, and his request was honored.

At this time of the year, we have a tendency to make fun of New Year's resolutions, because they are seldom kept long-term. This does not mean that resolutions are a bad thing, however.

Where would Daniel have been without his resolution not to eat at the king's table? What if he had not “purposed in his heart”?

What things do we need to resolve to do in this new year? Pray and read our Bibles more regularly? Put first things first in our lives? Be more involved in the Lord's work? Be more kind? Make an effort to lead someone to Christ? Treat others as we would want to be treated? And, the list goes on.

May each of us purpose in our hearts what we will do in 2016.
