

VETERANS

This coming Wednesday is Veterans Day. It began as Armistice Day, and marked the end of WWI with the signing of the Treaty of Versailles. That treaty was signed on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month. President Woodrow Wilson declared November 11, 1919 as the first Armistice Day.

In 1954, congress struck out the word “Armistice” and inserted “Veterans.” The “war to end all wars” (WWI) did not do that. After WWII, November 11 became a day to honor American veterans of all wars.

So, on Wednesday, we will honor brave men and women for their patriotism, love of country, and willingness to serve and sacrifice for the preservation of democracy. It is most fitting that we do this.

To borrow the words of Paul, **“Render therefore to all their due . . . honor to whom honor”** (Rom. 13:7).

I would remind us that there are also veterans in God’s army. By definition, a veteran is “a person who has had long service or experience in a particular occupation or field.”


