WHO'S ON FIRST?

Many of us remember the old Abbott and Costello routine, “Who’s On First?” Every time I hear or read it, I still laugh.

What about being serious in asking this question? In our lives, who’s on first? Who do we value most?

For the Christian, the answer should be obvious. God should be first in our lives. In fact, He will accept no other place.

In the middle of the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus said, “**But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you**” (Matt. 6:33). The things mentioned in this chapter—food, clothing, and shelter—always have a place, but God is to be first.

This prompts another serious question, however. How can we tell if God is first in our lives or not? The following may help.

- ✓ **Do you/I give Him the first hour of the day** as we read Scripture, meditate, and pray (Psa. 1)?
- ✓ **Do you/I give Him the first day of the week** as we worship Him and fellowship with the saints (Heb. 10:124-25)?
- ✓ **Do you/I give Him the first portion of our pay** as we lay by in store as we have been prospered (1 Cor. 16:1-2)?
- ✓ **Do you/I give Him the first consideration in every decision** as we make our plans (Jas. 4:15)?
- ✓ **Do you/I give Him the first place in our heart** as we live before Him each day (Matt. 22:37-38)?

God deserves to be first in our lives. That is true whether we are young or old. If He is not first in our lives, let’s resolve to make Him so!
