PROPER ATTITUDES FOR A BIBLE STUDENT

For many years, while teaching at The East Tennessee School of Preaching and Missions, I gave the following list to the students the first time I had them for a class. I wanted to begin by laying a good foundation for our time together as students of God's Word.

I found the list a few days ago, and thought I would share it with you.

- The Bible is the inspired, inerrant Word of God, and is all -sufficient for matters relating to the soul (2 Tim. 3:16-17).
- The language of the Bible is purposeful and meaningful. Meaning can be extracted, and understanding can occur (John 8:32; Eph. 3:3-4).
- A consideration of the original language may be essential to the correct understanding of the text (2 Tim. 2:15).
- Truth is truth no matter where it is found or who says it. The same is true of error. We must be honest searchers after truth (Acts 17:11).
- All truth should be accepted, regardless of tradition or commonly held beliefs (Matt. 15:8-9; John 17:17).
- It is never wrong to question. All questions should be discussed openly, calmly, and lavishly (Eph. 4:15; Col. 4:6).

This would be a good list to carry in your Bible, don't you think?
