

WHAT DO THEY MEAN?

Statistics can be interesting, troubling, and even a little difficult to apply. That is true regarding those listed below.

The November issue of *Christianity Today* compared the average age of people in the United States with that of various religious groups.

The average age in the United States is 38. The average age of those in the United Methodist Church is 58, which was the highest listed. The lowest was 32 and was for adherents to Islam. Among those who identified as "nothing in particular," the average age was 43.

The average age for churches of Christ was 48, which was one of the lowest among main-line churches.

Interesting! But, what does it all mean?

For years we have heard that churches must give particular attention to young people. On the other hand, we have heard a great deal about "The Graying of the Church," and that the contributions and needs of the elderly must not be ignored.

The truth is that the church is graying, i.e., the average age of its members is rising. The truth is also that we must pay attention to our young people. The future of the church will be determined largely by those who are young now, and sadly many of them are drifting away.

My conclusion is that people of every age and in every circumstance are important. They all have their particular strengths and needs. The Lord wants them all to be faithful, working members of His church. It's up to us to survey the situation and act accordingly. We want none to be neglected.
