



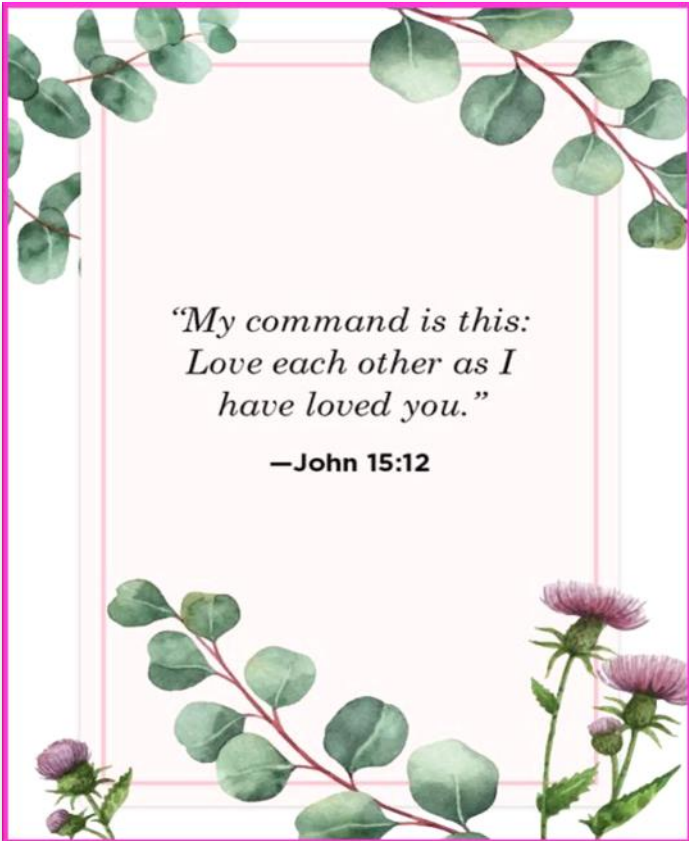

LOVING GOD AND ONE ANOTHER

According to the Talmud (a book containing early Jewish civil and religious laws) there were 613 laws. 248 were positive, and 365 were negative.

Then, as if there was nothing better to do, the rabbis would sit around and debate which one of all the laws was the greatest. Many felt that the command to remember the Sabbath and keep it holy was the greatest.

As recorded in Matthew 22:34-40, a lawyer asked Jesus His opinion on the matter. Much to the surprise of those who heard Him, Jesus quoted the Shema of Deuteronomy 6:5: **“You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength.”**

Then, giving them more than they asked for, Jesus quoted Leviticus 19:18: **“... but you shall love your neighbor as yourself ...”**

Jesus said everything else hung on these two commandments (Matt. 22:40). Why? Because when we get these two commandments right, everything else falls into place.

When we love God supremely, we will gladly do the things He has asked us to do. When we love our neighbors as we should, we will treat them as we would want to be treated.

Love God first. Love others second. It’s that easy. It’s that hard.
