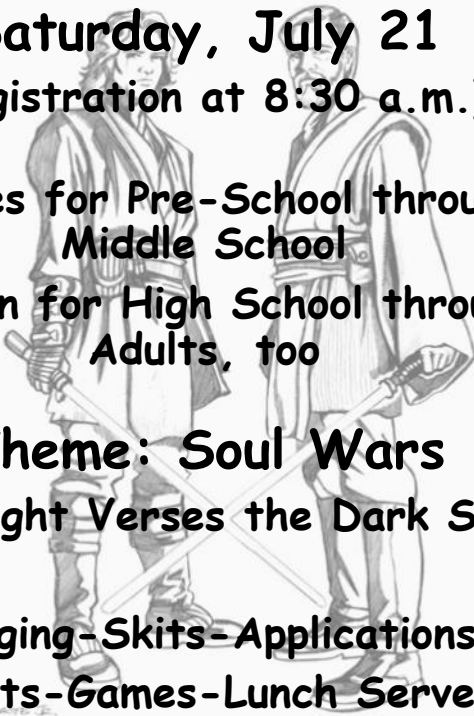

I AM NOT ASHAMED

Every day I see several political ads on television. I have especially taken interest in those for the candidates running for governor in Tennessee.

They have spoken opening about their faith. One says that faith, family, and a well-paying job for everyone are priorities for him. Another says that his relationship with Christ is the most important thing in his life. A third says that she still has the Bible her parents gave her and it guides her every day.

I guess I could be cynical and say they are all just playing to the electorate. This is the Bible belt, after all. I don't believe I have a right to do that without proof. I just take them at their word.

I must say I appreciate the fact that they speak of their faith so openly. I'm afraid their boldness puts many of us to shame.

In Romans 1:16, Paul declared that he was not ashamed of the gospel of Christ. In Philippians 1:20, he wrote, **“according to my earnest expectation and hope that in nothing I shall be ashamed, but with all boldness, as always, so now also Christ will be magnified in my body, whether by life or death.”** That should be the prayer of each of us!

In this climate, when many are speaking so openly of their faith, may we do the same, remembering that if we are ashamed of Him, He will be ashamed of us (cf. Matt. 10:32-33). We must not be obnoxious, but we must stand up and let people know by word and deed to Whom we belong.
