CONFORMED OR TRANSFORMED?

On a recent "That's a Good Question" video podcast, I answered a question about Lot's tragic decision to take his family to live in Sodom. The question dealt specifically with Lot's offer to give his two virgin daughters to a depraved mob, which was asking him to send out two guests that were in his home so that they might have their way with them.

There is no way to justify his behavior. If you're interested, you can read all about it in Genesis 19, or you can look it up on our Facebook page and listen to my answer.

As I read the account in Genesis, I realized that much worse than Lot's being in Sodom was that Sodom was in him and his family.

Romans 12:2 says, "And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God."

God calls us to be transformed and not conformed. That's easier said than done, however. The world's pressure on us to conform to its way of thinking and acting is both real and strong.

As Romans 12:2 says, we can be transformed when we renew our minds, i.e., when we start thinking as we should. That's why Philippians 4:8 says, "Finally, brethren, whatever things are true, whatever things are noble, whatever things are just, whatever things are pure, whatever things are lovely, whatever things are of good report, if there is any virtue and if there is anything praiseworthy—meditate on these things."

Stay out of Sodom. Change your thinking. Be transformed and not conformed.


