## **AN INSCRIPTION IN A BIBLE**

Several years ago, I bought a new Bible for Sierra. I inscribed it, **“Each for the other, and both for God.”**

I wish I could claim originality for those words, but I can’t..

As a first-year student at Ohio Valley College, I heard West Virginia’s distinguished United State’s Senator, the late Jennings Randolph, speak. He told of his own graduation from Salem College in 1920. On that occasion, his mother presented him with a Bible, and on the flyleaf she had inscribed those same words: “Each for the other, and both for God.”

What power there is in those words. Any young man would be blessed to receive that sage advice from his mother. How many problems between parents and children, mates, friends, and brother and sisters in Christ would be avoided, if we followed that advice.

The truthfulness of that inscription is deeply rooted in Scripture. Listen. **“Let each of your look not only for his own interests, but also for the interests of others”** (Phil. 2:4). **“But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness . . .”** (Matt. 6:33).

Remember: “Each for the other, and both for God.” Therein is the key to happiness and success.
