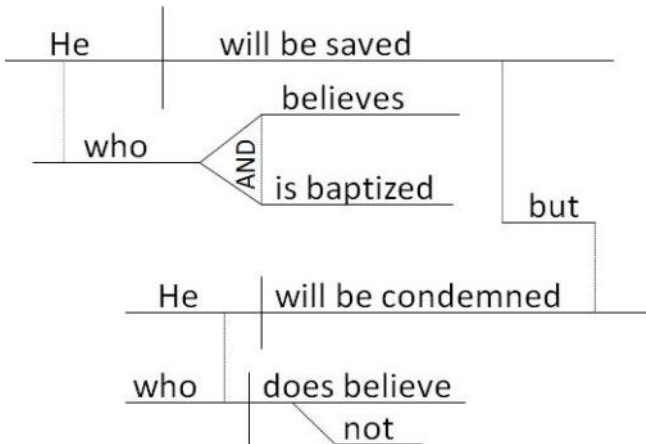


MARK 16:16

After commissioning His disciples to go into all **the world and preach the gospel to every creature, Jesus said, “He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned”** (Mark 16:16).

Simple enough, wouldn't you think? As our pioneer preachers used to say, “It takes two things to save you and one thing to cause you to be lost.” Jesus made both faith and baptism prerequisites to salvation. A person who does not believe is lost at that point, whether he is baptized or not (John 3:18).

Do you remember having to diagram sentences during your school years? I certainly do. Below is a diagram of Mark 16:16. Perhaps it will help clarify the issue for some who are not sure about the necessity of baptism to salvation.
