

WORDS

A preacher has been described as "someone who talks in other people's sleep." In some cases, I'm sure that it is.

At any rate, preachers do talk, and they talk a lot. Here are some figures that might surprise you.

The average sermon contains 4,500-5,000 words. Most located preachers present 90-100 sermons each year to the same congregation.

Let's take the middle number of each of the statistics and do the math. 4,750 words times 95 sermons equals a total of 451,250 words. That's a lot of words.

The average novel has 50,000 words. This means that the average preacher in an average year will speak the number of words found in between 9 and 10 novels.

Do you feel my pain in speaking this many words from the pulpit each year? Can you understand why I might misspeak from time-to-time or mispronounce one of those 451,250 words?

Do I feel your pain? Do I understand that you must sit there and try to listen intently? Do I see why you might nod off sometimes? Do I know that you might have trouble understanding or keeping up with what I am saying?

Let's make a deal. I will do the best I can do in speaking those words, and you do the best you can do in hearing them. I will work hard at being understood, and you work hard at understanding me.

It's more than just words. Remember, "For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God" (1 Cor. 1:18).
