TIPS FOR SUNDAY WORSHIP

Recently, **Jack Wilkie**—who works with Focus Press—posted eleven tips for making our Sunday worship more beneficial. Because of the space available, I will share just some of them today.

- ✓ **Rest up.** Don't stay up late Saturday night and get caught sleeping through the sermon.
- ✓ **Pray before you go.** Pray for yourself, for your church family, for the preacher and teachers, and that God would be honored.
- ✓ **Get there early.** Make time for fellowship with the family and to greet new faces. For the same reasons, don't dart out the door the minute it ends.
- ✓ **Take a moment to remember why you are there.** To prevent rote, overly ritualistic worship, take a moment before it starts to think on what (and Whom) you're there for.
- ✓ **Discuss the worship afterward.** It's easy to stand around and talk about the weather, the football game, work, or anything else. Take "church" outside the building by discussing it (the sermon, the songs, the Lord's Supper talk, etc.) in your chats afterward or over lunch.
- ✓ **Go again next week and whenever you can.** Sporadic attendance guarantees a person stays immature, disconnected from the church family and unable to participate in the work of the church.

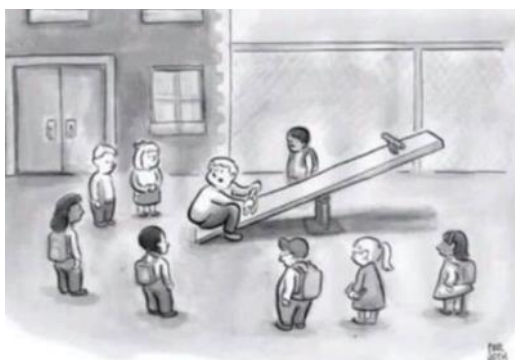
