IF YOU FIND IT EASY TO BE A CHRISTIAN, YOU PROBABLY AREN'T ONE

Not long ago, **Matt Walsh** wrote an article for **theblaze** under the title above.

Maybe I need to begin with some explanation. **Matt Walsh** is a 29-year-old blogger who is a devout Catholic and has a fundamental approach to theology. **Theblaze** is a digital network that provides a platform for conservative unfiltered voices.

Don't feel bad. I had to look it up.

I must say I was intrigued by the title. I believe Walsh is right. At the beginning of his blog, he wrote, "Over 80 percent of the people in this country claim to be Christians, but how many, in the end, will find out the hard way that their claims were false? Our culture seems perfectly designed to lead us into this sort of false faith . . ."

Walsh used Joel Osteen as an example of someone who promotes that idea that "the faith is nothing more than a collection of vague and friendly sentiments." Sad, isn't it. But, true!

Jesus said, "**If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow Me**" (Luke 9:23).

Self denial! Daily cross bearing! Following Jesus wherever He leads! None of that sounds easy to me.

This is not to say that it is just too difficult to be a Christian. It is to say, however, that it takes effort. It requires more than a fish sticker on our bumpers or a Bible quote on our Facebook page. It demands sacrifice. It requires putting Christ first, and living for Him daily.
