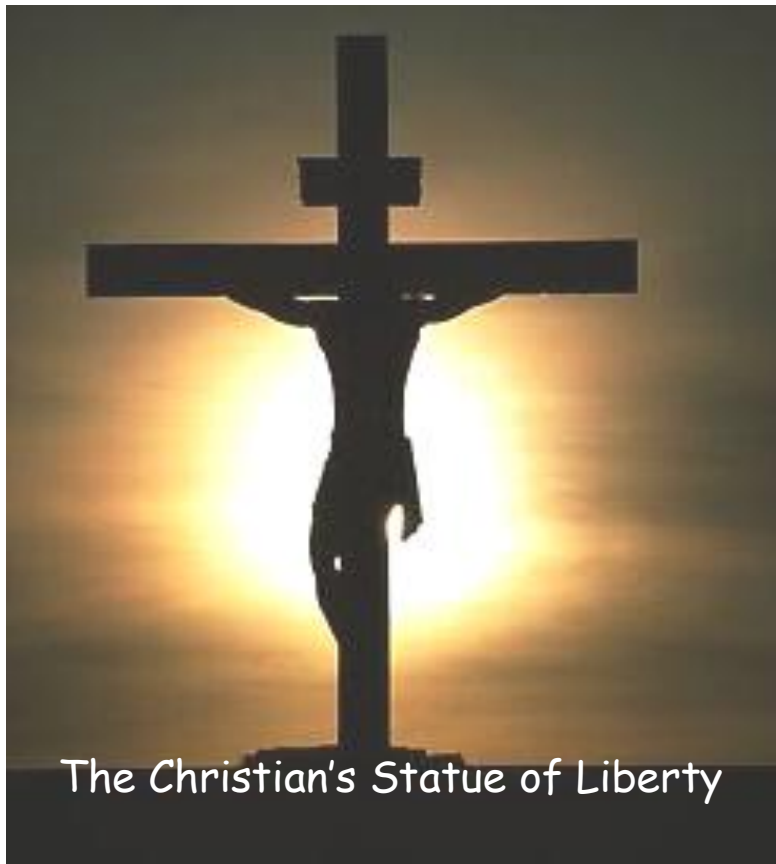

PAT SUMMITT HAS DIED

Early last Tuesday morning, Pat Summitt, legendary former coach of the Lady Vols basketball team, passed away. She coached at Tennessee for 38 years from 1974-2012. During this time, she had 1,096 wins, and her teams won 8 NCAA championships. She was loved and revered in Tennessee and beyond.

In August of 2011, she was diagnosed with early-onset Alzheimer's disease. That terrible disease felled someone who was almost bigger than life.

Pat Summitt was known for many things other than the stats about wins, losses, and championships. Her work ethic was well known. Those who didn't perform as she thought they should were the recipient of her famous icy stare. She emphasized that her players might not always be the most talented but that they could always out-hustle their opponents. More than just coaching basketball, she coached life. She had a 100% graduation rate for those who finished their eligibility at Tennessee.

The thing that impressed me the most about Coach Summitt was her humility. She was always the farm-girl from Henrietta, TN. In spite of all the trophies, medals and accolades, she regularly said, "It's not about me." She would add, "It's about the University," or "It's about the team," or "It's about women's basketball."

That is the attitude we must have about the church and its work. It is not about me, or you, or any other individual. Our cause is so much bigger than any person. God forbid that our egos ever get in the way of our service.

Remember, it's not about me or you. It is about Christ. It is about the church. It is about our spiritual family. It is about our community. It is about souls.
