A SERVANT'S HEART

A Jasper County Missouri deputy sheriff, **Nolan Murray**, was shot in the back recently while trying to serve a search warrant at an Econo Lodge. Deputy Murray is a member of the Hillcrest church of Christ in Neosho, MO.

I was especially interested in how Hillcrest Minister, Danny Boggs, described Murray. **“He’s a great guy . . . He’s very servant-hearted.”** Boggs went on to say that the deputy is known for putting the needs of others above his own.

Our emphasis this year at Seymour is about being better servants. Our Lord was a servant, and He wants us to be servants, too (John 13:13-15).

Being a servant does begin in the heart. We will never be servants until we begin to think like a servant. That is why Paul recorded, **“Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus”** (Phil. 2:5).
