COUNT YOUR BLESSINGS

It's number 539 in our hymnal. The chorus of *Count Your Blessings* says, "Count your blessings, name them one by one. Count your many blessings, see what God has done."

In an article I read sometime ago, the author suggested that counting our blessings one by one was not a fast enough way to do it. According to the article, verse two should read, "Count your blessings, name them two by two. Count your many blessings, see what God can do."
