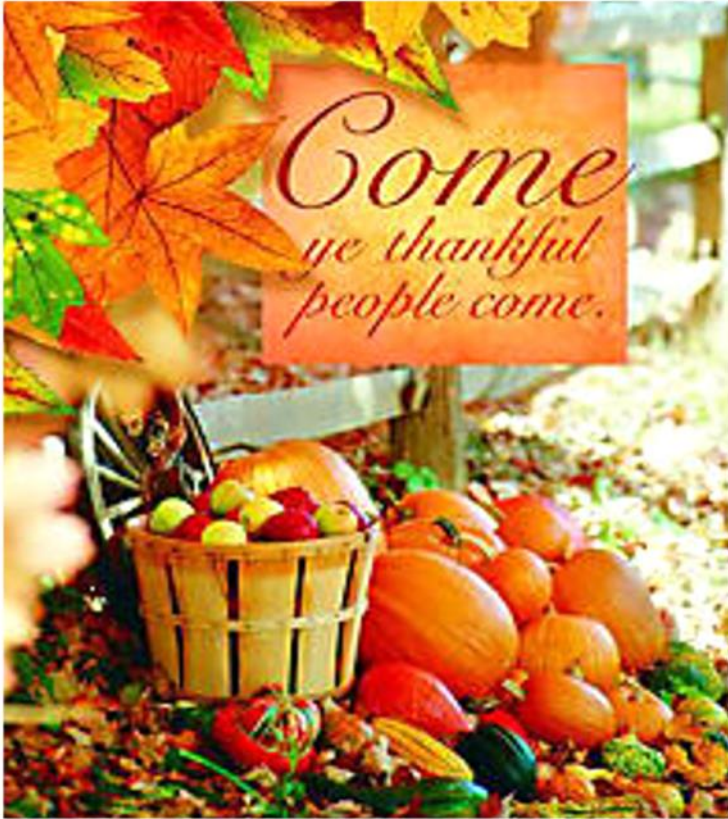

SERMONS FOR NOVEMBER

Thanksgiving is my favorite holiday of the year. The idea of giving thanks for all our blessings is very much in keeping with the spirit of Christianity.

Colossians 3:17 says it simply and directly: “And let the peace of God rule in your hearts, to which also you were called in one body, **and be thankful.**”

In keeping with the idea of being thankful, the Sunday morning sermons in November will be a series entitled “**Praise and Thanksgiving In the Psalms.**”

In the preface to the *Truth for Today Commentary on Psalms 1-50* by Eddie Clower, Don Shackelford wrote: “The psalms have been at the center of worship for both the Jews and the Christians since they were written. They were sung (or chanted) in the temple and synagogue worship of the Jews. They were on the lips of Christians as they worshiped ‘speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing, and making melody with [their] heart[s] to the Lord’” (Eph. 5:19).”

I have chosen four of the psalms, which deal with the subject of praise and thanksgiving, to focus on during November. They are Psalm 32, 100, 103, and 146.

I invite, and encourage, you to take this journey with me. Let’s learn to be more thankful and to praise our wonderful God, by looking at these psalms next month.

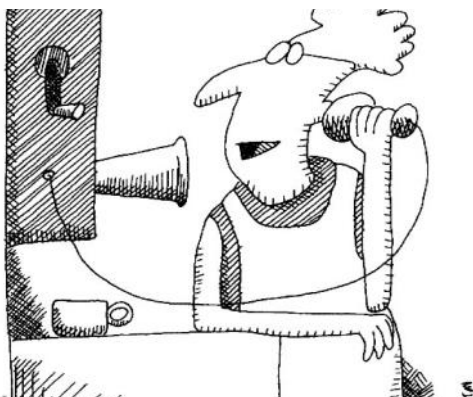
