THE LORD'S SUPPER

Jesus instituted the Lord's Supper shortly before His death. During the Passover meal, He "took bread, blessed it, and gave it to the disciples and said, 'Take, eat; this is My body.' Then He took the cup and gave thanks and gave it to them, saying, 'Drink from it all of you. For this is My blood of the new covenant, which is shed for many for the remission of sins.'" (Matt. 26:26-28).

Luke's account adds, "do this in remembrance of Me" (Luke 22:19). The early church did exactly that. They observed the Lord's Sunday each Lord's Day as He instructed.

Acts 20:7 states that the church at Troas also came together on the first day of the week "to break bread" (Acts 20:7). Paul preached on that occasion, but the purpose of their coming together was to observe the Lord's Supper in memory of Jesus' death.

The church at Corinth observed the Lord's Supper when they came "together as a church" and when they came "together in one place" (1 Cor. 11:18,20). Though they had some serious problems associated with observing this memorial, they got the day right. It was the same day they gave as they had been prospered (1 Cor. 16:1-2).

As Christ's church today, we are privileged to continue the observance of this important memorial supper. Let us not take it lightly. It is a precious opportunity to commune with the Lord and His people.

Our pioneer preachers used to say, "The place for the Lord's people on the Lord's day is in the Lord's house around the Lord's table." I agree.
